All Dilapidation Deposits received are registered and placed with the Deposit Protection Service.

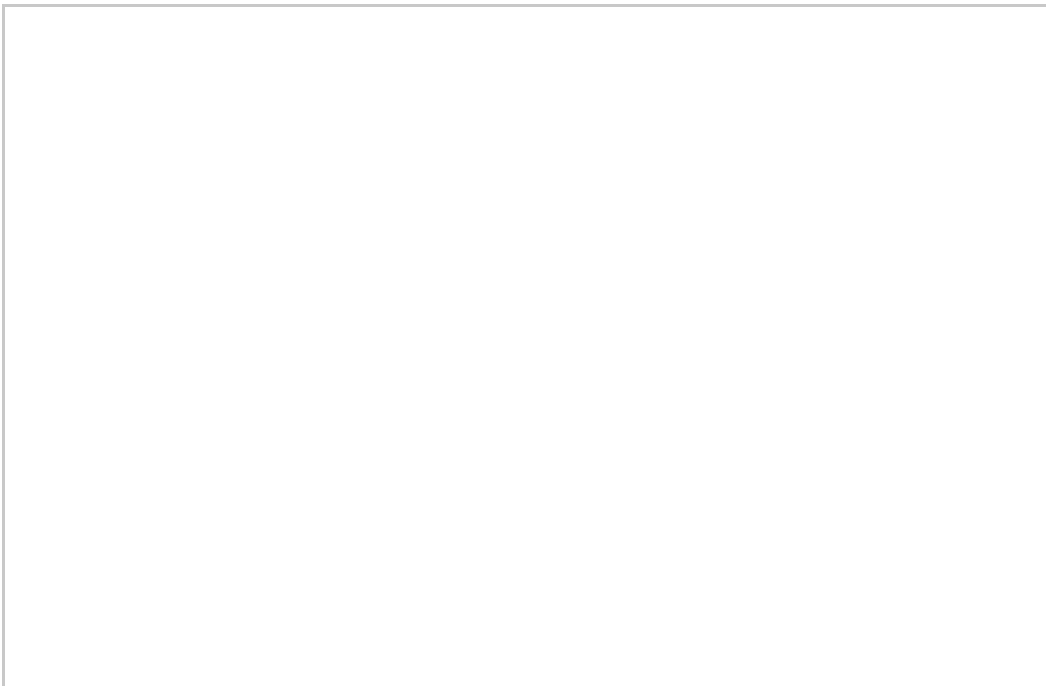

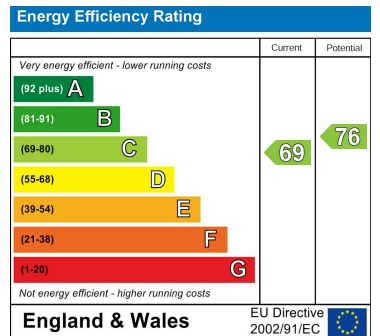
